The ministry continues to move forward despite some difficulties and each of our children continue to press forward in their careers and prayerfully this two-page update will give you a little glimpse as to what the Lord has been doing through our family:

Crystal, Cassandra, and Daniel on the first of August will be entering their one year mandatory social service that is required by law for almost all careers here in Mexico. In order for Mexico to meet the great demand of medical needs of so many people that have little to no money they deploy over 8000 medical students (with little to no pay) yearly to rural areas. This is why Mexico is able to economically give out free health care to many of these clinics which have very limited medical resources. Our children will be serving in 3 different clinics which are fairly close to each other and for that reason we are not having to rent another home in Chihuahua. Thank you Jesus for answering this prayer!



These past months have been very difficult on our church family here in San Juanito because of losing loved ones. First of all, the wife (Obdulia) of our worship leader Fidel, went home to be with Jesus on the 30th of May. She was only 58 years old, and fought cancer for 5 months. Two days later, a brother of a sister in the church who was 37 years old was killed unmercifully, and then the next day, a 17 year old son of another brother in the church, was killed by the hands of the drug lords. All these deaths occurred within five working days, so needless to say it was a very hard time on all of us and we continue to minister to these families.



Daniel preached at the pulpit for the first time on May 7th since Mark was out of town. Afterwards we hosted a Mother's Day dinner—allowing the husbands to serve the ladies before partaking in the meal.





Crystal and Cassandra completed their one year of Internship on June 30. We are so proud of them for overcoming all the challenges they faced and the many long night shift hours they worked—averaging 90 hours per week. How exciting it is to see how they have pressed forward completing yet another year!



Mark baptized three young ladies on June 4 while Daniel and Fidel accompanied us music. Afterwards we roasted hot dogs to celebrate with all those that participated in this special event!



During the month of May, Mark was gone for about three weeks working for a family in Alaska and then again in the middle of June until the middle of July, he and Daniel both flew to Alaska to continue the work. Roxane remained here in San Juanito to oversee the ministry and to deal with any issues that needed to be dealt with. Roxane was very thankful that Crystal and Cassandra spent their vacation days with her in San Juanito so she wouldn't have to be alone for the complete duration of the time that Mark and Daniel were in Alaska.
